# DAYTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS GOALS

Our Goals:

Achievement: By 2021, 80% of all Dayton Public Schools students will meet or exceed proficient ratings in reading and math as measured by state and/or national assessments.

**Growth:** All students in grades 1-8 will demonstrate at least 1.5 years academic growth as measured by state or national assessments. 100% of students in grades 9-12 will earn one credit in the four core areas per year to be on track for graduation.

**Attendance and Behavior:** By 2021, Dayton Public Schools will achieve a 5-10% increase in staff and attendance and decrease 5 percentage points of behavior suspension days with a 1-2 percentage point annual incremental change as measured by district wide attendance and behavior data.
