The parents, students and staff of Valerie Elementary will partner together to develop this School-Parent Compact for achievement. DAYTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS GOALS

Our Goals:

Achievement: By 2024, 80% of all Dayton Public Schools students will meet or exceed proficient ratings in reading and math as measured by state and/or national assessments.

Growth: All students in grades 1-8 will demonstrate at least 1.5 years academic growth as measured by state or national assessments. 100% of students in grades 9-12 will earn one credit in the four core areas per year to be on track for graduation.

Attendance and Behavior: By 2021, Dayton Public Schools will achieve a 5-10% increase in staff and attendance and decrease 5 percentage points of behavior suspension days with a 1-2 percentage point annual incremental change as measured by district wide attendance and behavior data.

Mission Statement

To equip our students to achieve success in a global society by implementing an effective and rigorous curriculum with fidelity.

OUR SCHOOL, VALERIE ELEMENTARY GOALS:

- Our school will increase the percentage of students reading at grade level by using direct instruction as well as the following interventions: Grades K-2 95% Phonics; Grades 2-6 MindPlay Reading Program.
- Our school will work to ensure all third graders pass the state mandated Third Grade Reading Guarantee with proficiency, which means based on the Ohio State Test, not just the cut or minimum score achievable.
- Our school will work to raise our daily attendance rate to 90% or higher; which means we need all students present daily, especially Mondays and Fridays.

To help your child meet the district’s and school’s goals, the school, you and your child will work together on the following items.

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES

We will:

- Families should attend Parent Data Meetings (September); Parent Teacher Conference in October and March. These conferences are being held to not just review the grades, but offer Data on each individual students’ progress in all subjects (especially reading and math)
- Families should strive to attend any family engagement hosted by district, school, or community partners. School events (Science/Math Night-November; ELA focus (spring 2023)

PARENTS RESPONSIBILITIES

We, as parents, will:

- Staying informed about my child’s education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and responding, as appropriate
- Get students to bed in a responsible time
- Sign up and check Home Access for grades weekly
- Monitoring amount of television my children watch
- Volunteering in my child’s classroom
- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my children’s education
- Promoting positive use of my child’s extracurricular time
- Attend conferences and workshops offered
