JOINTLY DEVELOPED

Families provide input through formal and informal meetings. Feedback is gathered through surveys and parent meetings. Parents always have the opportunity to provide feedback and meet with staff.

DAYTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS GOALS

Our Goals:

Achievement: By 2021, 80% of all Dayton Public Schools students will meet or exceed proficient rating in reading and math as measured by state and/or national assessments.

Growth: All students in grades 1-8 will demonstrate at least 1.5 years academic growth as measured by state or national assessments. 100% of students in grades 9-12 will earn one credit in the four core areas per year to be on track for graduation.

Attendance and Behavior: By 2021, Dayton Public Schools will achieve a 5-10% increase in staff and attendance and decrease 5 percentage points of behavior suspension days with a 1-2 percentage point annual incremental change as measured by district wide attendance and behavior data.

Cleveland Elementary School GOALS:

Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

1. The school's curriculum will be based on mandated benchmarks and follow the district pacing guide.

Mathematics- My Math for grade levels K-6 materials will be utilized and supported through various research-based strategies and programs. In school intervention



strategies such as Red Bird and ALEKS will be offered to students struggling in math as a means to achieve full academic potential.

2. Reading- We will continue to work with our students to building a strong reading foundation. The Reading Wonders series gives students the opportunity to access complex text through high quality instruction. Students will be able to find and use text evidence as well as engage in collaborative conversations with peers. Interventions such as Mindplay, Redbird, WonderWorks and LLI will give additional support to students needing to strengthen their foundational reading skills.

To help your child meet the district's and school's goals, the school, you and your child will work together on the following items.
