I recommend approval to correct the new school name David H. Ponitz Career Technical Center previously approved by the Board to David H. Ponitz Career Technology Center.

Rationale

The Dayton Board of Education (the Board) is undertaking a Classroom Facilities Assistance Program Project in cooperation with the Ohio School Facilities Commission (OSFC) through the OSFC's Accelerated Urban Program, which will result in the construction of new school facilities and renovations and additions to existing facilities within the school district, as described in a Master Plan accepted by the Board. As the District starts the transformation into a new era, the student population will shift and schools will be consolidated therefore it may be necessary for the District to name new school buildings. The new high school will be populated with the students from Patterson Career Center.

The Board approved the new school name at its February 15, 2006 meeting, in recognition of Sinclair Community College President Emeritus David H. Ponitz, who in 22 years at the helm, built Sinclair into one of America's leading two-year institutions of higher learning.

Nationally respected as a cutting-edge leader, Ponitz forged strong partnerships with Dayton Public Schools, helping DPS students make a successful transition to college by earning credits toward an associate's degree while still in high school. The partnership continues to grow, providing Dayton students opportunities to pursue today's prevalent higher-paying jobs that demand advanced degrees or some training beyond high school.

The new name is more aligned with AP/STEM initiatives. The new career technology center will serve students in grades nine through 12 and will be organized around four career pathways: arts and communication; business/information technology; engineering and industrial systems; and health and education. Within those pathways, DPS will offer 16 career technology programs.

Any previous items of business approved by the Dayton Board of Education and relevant to the new school will apply under the corrected name David H. Ponitz Career Technology Center.

The Construction Manager, in conjunction with the school district's staff and consultants, evaluated the bid and met with representatives of the company and checked with the references for the company.

Based on the information reviewed and evaluated, the Dayton Public Schools Chief Construction Officer recommends to the Superintendent and Board of Education that the above is the lowest responsible bidder for the demolition of the Roosevelt Center Building, under Segment III of the Accelerated Urban Building Replacement Program, and further recommend awarding the contract for Demolition of the Roosevelt Center Building to Evans Landscaping, Inc., in the amount of \$844,800.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Dayton Board of Education of the Dayton City School District, Montgomery County, Ohio, that the Board of Education accepts the recommendation of the Superintendent and award the Demolition of the Roosevelt Center Building, under Segment III of the Accelerated Urban Building Replacement Program to Evans Landscaping, Inc., subject to any required approvals by OSFC.
