Fairview Elementary School students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement, as well as describes how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the state's high standards.

JOINTLY DEVELOPED

The parents, students and staff of Fairview Elementary School partnered together to develop this School-Parent Compact for achievement. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added input about the types of support they needed and students told us what would help them learn. Parents are encouraged to attend annual revision meetings each August to review the compact and make suggestions based on student needs and school improvement goals. Parents also are encouraged to participate in the annual Title I parent survey that is used as a tool to collect parent feedback regarding the current Title I programs and policies.

To understand how working together can benefit your child, it is first important to understand the district's and school's goals for student academic achievement.

DAYTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS GOALS

Our Goals:

Achievement: By 2021, 80% of all Dayton Public Schools students will meet or exceed proficient rating in reading and math as measured by state and/or national assessments.

Growth: All students in grades 1-8 will demonstrate at least 1.5 years academic growth as measured by state or national assessments. 100% of students in grades 9-12 will earn one credit in the four core areas per year to be on track for graduation.

Attendance and Behavior: By 2021, Dayton Public Schools will achieve a 5-10% increase in staff and attendance and decrease 5 percentage points of behavior suspension days with a 1-2 percentage point annual incremental

FAIRVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL GOALS

- #1: By May 2023, 80% of students will grow $\frac{3}{4}$ of a year from Fall to Winter and grow $\frac{3}{4}$ of a year from Winter to Spring as measured by NWEA MAP. (1.5 years growth total within the school year.)
- #2: By May 2023, restorative Tier 1 systems will be in place in every classroom at a skilled level which will result in a decrease of all referrals by 25%. Further, systems will be implemented to support Tier 2 and Tier 3 students, resulting in a 25% decrease in referrals and an increase in staff and student perception of safety.

To help your child meet the district's and school's goals, the school, you and your child will work together on the following items.

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES

Fairview Elementary School will:

- Teachers and Administration will provide families with regular communication about instructional and school-wide information on a weekly basis using ClassDojo, ParentSquare, and hardcopy communication.
- Teachers will provide individualized, differentiated instruction to students in whole group, small group, and one-on-one settings to meet the unique needs of each child
- All staff members will prioritize the social-emotional health of each child and prioritize the use of restorative practices.

PARENTS RESPONSIBILITIES

We, as parents, will:

- Families will make an effort to attend Parent-Teacher Conferences, Family Engagement Events, Parent Workshops, and take advantage of available resources.
- Parents will engage in two-way communication with Teachers, Staff, and Administration so that a climate of effective collaboration will develop
- Parents support students in engaging in web-based intervention programs, instruction, and homework.
- Parents will ensure that their child is at school and on time each and every day.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Students will bring home all school communication to parents
- Students will be on time and present at school each and every day.
- Students will show that they are responsible for their own learning by putting forth effort during instructional time, completing all assignments, and engaging in all opportunities for instruction.
- Students will follow 'The Fairview Way': Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe and In Control
