Mound Street Academy, students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement, as well as describes how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the state's high standards.

Jointly Developed:

To understand how working together can benefit your child, it is first important to understand the district's and school's goals for student academic achievement.

Dayton Public Schools Goals:

Instruction: By 2024, 80% of all Dayton Public Schools students will meet or exceed proficiency ratings in reading and math as measured by state and/or national assessments. Through extended professional development efforts focused on literacy and math, the district will provide opportunities for teachers to teach better and have a thorough understanding of the Science of Reading. The district will closely monitor implementation of the instruction in both literacy and math, providing support when needed. Each classroom in the Dayton schools will become a literacy classroom through more emphasis at the 7-12 grades on content area reading and comprehension.

Growth: 80% of students will score proficient or better on state tests. Students will be able to read at grade level both in fiction and nonfiction materials. Students will show they are able to read at any point when asked to read a passage. Students will be expected to solve math questions (conceptual and computation) with proficiency at the developmentally appropriate level.

Safe and Healthy Schools: 100% of the schools in DPS will offer support for safe and healthy schools as evidenced by personnel records, logs of contact, and observation of services being provided. District will support Student Resiliency Coordinators, Student Resource Counselors, the school based health clinics, models of Neighborhood School Centers in 9 locations (Westwood, Cleveland, Ruskin, Fairview, Edison, Kiser, Roosevelt, Belle Haven, MHS) and an MTSS model that provides data for all safety and health needs. The MTSS model will be carefully implemented and coordinated with other district initiatives. Each component of the program models will be monitored and evaluated by DPS staff.
