## **Athletic Event Behavioral Agreement**

As a student of Dayton Public Schools, you are bound by a moral and behavioral code. As an incentive for students who adhere to the district's behavior and attendance standards, you are eligible to receive free admission to your school's home athletic events. If you choose to accept this responsibility, you and your guardian must sign this contract, and in doing so, you agree to abide by the consequences set forth below:

Every member of (insert school name) has a duty to represent himself/herself/themselves, and the school in the best manner possible. This applies to your behavior both in school and out of school. You are expected to avoid situations where you might be accused of wrongdoing. Being in the "wrong place at the wrong time" is not an excuse if you choose to be there in the first place.

In-school discipline problems resulting in ISS or suspension will result in your loss of the privilege to attend district athletic events (both paid or free). The following violations may also result in suspension or loss of privilege to attend the (insert school name) Athletic events (both paid or free):

- **1.** Falling below 93% of attendance (attending at least 4 (four) out of 5 (five) days each school week and 3 (three) out of 4 (four days) on short weeks).
  - Students who do not meet the attendance standards are able to purchase tickets to events so long as they do not have any level 2 (two) or 3(three) referrals for the week.
- **2.** Fighting on or off school property.
- **3.** Using illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco at any time.
- **4.** Allowing yourself to be in a situation, in school or away from school, where you are arrested for an illegal activity.
- 5. Skipping class or school.
- 6. Poor sportsmanship in sporting events, towards fellow spectators, officials and participants.
- 7. Disrespectful conduct towards district staff.
- 8. Harassment (verbal/physical/sexual/etc...) of another student or district staff member.
- **9.** Electronic communication (text, Facebook, Twitter, etc...) should be positive and should never negatively reflect on other classmates or district staff. If it is not positive, don't post it.
- **10.** Any act (either in school or away from school) which in the opinion of the school administration, reflects negatively on the (insert school's name).

Students are responsible for bringing their student ID and QR codes to every event. Students are not permitted to share their ID'S or QR codes with other people. Students are also responsible for ensuring they have timely (provided in a reasonable timeframe after the event concludes) transportation home after each event.
