Why is phonological awareness important?

Phonological awareness is a strong predictor of reading success, especially at the earliest stages of reading development, and serves as a foundation for reading.

How can I support phonological awareness at home?

Supporting phonological awareness at home is simple—all you need is language! Help your child understand that the words they hear in speech are made up of parts and sounds. You can begin building phonological awareness in your child by allowing them to view our recorded 10-20 minute phonemic awareness video lessons.
